"A carer is anyone who cares, unpaid, for a friend or family member who due to illness, disability, mental health problem or an addiction cannot cope without their support."

There are over 788,000 carers across Scotland making a saving of £10.8 billion to the economy








A Young Carer is someone who is under the age of 18 who looks after someone in their family, or a friend, who is ill, disabled or misuses drugs or alcohol.

There are over 29,000 young carers in Scotland Some young carers look after more than one person and may have health issues of their own

# Came into force in April 2018 Young Carer Statements

 for carers under 18, or over 18 but still at school

#### **Adult Carer Assessments**

- Care planning
- Hospital discharge plans
- Carer strategy

Moving from good practice to legal requirements








1 in 10 pupils will have a caring responsibility

1 in 20 will miss school due to their caring role

39% said nobody in their school was aware of their caring role

26% have been bullied in school because of their caring role







### What can you do?
