Online Child Sexual Exploitation, Abuse and Harassment and Harmful Digital Behaviour - Exploring and Understanding Current Challenges

Annabel Turner, Director, Cyber Safe Scotland

A relaxed session exploring attendees recent experiences of supporting and understanding digital harm, online child sexual exploitation and the normalisation of online abuse and harassment. Annabel will invite attendees to share experiences safely and will share learning from Cybersafe Scotland's most recent project - Respected and Safe Online - working to reduce online abuse and harassment against all children but particularly girls. There will also be the opportunity for further support for practitioners through a question and answer session.

Biography: Annabel is a specialist in online child protection, online child sexual exploitation, harassment and abuse. She practised as a barrister for 10 years before working with IJM on the International "Not on my Screen" campaign. She is a Director of Cybersafe Scotland, who provide evidence-based services for schools, professionals and parents. She chairs the Child Exploitation Group for Aberdeen Council - and has oversight of all cases involving online Child Sexual Exploitation and Child Criminal Exploitation in the North-East of Scotland. She has 2 children who adore Pokemon which makes her a Pokemum.
